The Messenger 2024 PASTOR'S PEN: CALENDAR CALCULATIONS





In 2024, Easter falls on March 31. Does that date seem early this year? Well, it is. At least it is earlier than in recent years.

MARCH

There's something different about the Easter holiday. Christmas is always on December 25, but Easter, like the eponymous bunny, hops around. That has everything to do with the early Christian church. They wanted the celebration to occur around the

Jewish Passover. In the gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, the Last Supper was a Passover meal. In John, Jesus is crucified on the same day as the Passover lambs are being slaughtered. The Hebrew calendar is tied to the lunar and solar cycles, so the Passover dates vary, meaning Easter also varies.

The changing date does cause some consternation (especially among church staff), but it is better today than it has been in the past. Back then, there was no standard way of calculating the date for Easter. There were competing calendars, and astronomical data was less precise than today. Slight variations would creep in. It was not uncommon to find different Christian communities celebrating Easter on different dates. In fact, some communities even celebrated the holiday on a weekday. These differences sometimes grew into deep fights.

To promote Christian unity, the Council of Nicaea in AD 325 standardized the date to the first Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox. Still, some wondered if this was less about Christian unity and more about control by the bishop of Rome. Debates in the West about the date of Easter raged well into the Seventh Century. Even today, the Eastern Orthodox Church calculates the date a bit differently. They will be celebrating this year on May 5.

If you are like me, all this talk of calendars and dates is a bit confusing. Celebrating Jesus Christ's resurrection doesn't require waiting for an annual date on the calendar. In fact, Christians celebrate Jesus' victory over death every week. Very early, Christians replaced the Jewish day of worship, the Sabbath, Saturday, with the Lord's Day, Sunday. Rather than waiting for a holy day, Christ redeemed all of time. Easter is a great time to renew our faith, to embrace God's love and Christ's triumph. However, the best time is actually right now.

NEWS FROM SESSION

FEBRUARY 2024



This was an informational meeting only since there was no quorum present. The annual records review was successfully completed with no findings. The Deacons and the Worship Committee are discussing Chancel flowers. When Chancel flowers are available, the Deacons share them with those who are ill or homebound, but there may be no flowers if someone hasn't purchased them. If anyone is interested in purchasing Chancel flowers, they can contact the church office. Online ordering is also being considered.

Building and Grounds reported that a laptop computer for the office was ordered and received. The outdoor basketball hoop will be reinstalled when the weather breaks. The committee is looking for volunteers to help with interior painting. The flickering Sanctuary and Chancel lights are being addressed. The Christian Education Committee reported that planning is underway for the middle school mission trip to Toledo and the senior high mission trip to Puerto Rico. Youth group activities are doing well. Plans are underway for the Hosanna Celebration on March 24th, which will be a sensory experience. Family workshops are scheduled for March 9th (pre-2nd grade) and March 16th (tween).

The Fellowship Committee reported that 74 people attended the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper despite the power outage and fifty-nine people participated in the first Lenten Soup Supper. FPC members are participating in the Belize Mission Trip and the Asian Mission Outreach Conference. The Outreach Committee has started planning for the 2024 National Day of Prayer. The planned speaker will be John Soisson.

The Stewardship Committee reported that the 2024 Per Capita is \$39.10 per active member and that investment performance will be reviewed in March. Mid-Week Lenten devotions are based on *The Jesus Storybook* followed by communion. Preparing for Holy Week worship services and Easter Sunday worship services. The bell choir and Hodge Podge are taking a break and will return in April.



"For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are - yet was without sin." Hebrews 4:15

We talked about temptation in a HYPE'D lesson. We looked at some different examples of temptation in the Bible. Moses' anger, Jonah's running away, the rich young ruler, Adam and Eve.

We talked about a lot but focused on three in particular. Samson, King David, and Joseph. Samson had strength, David had power, and both were chosen by God. Yet, both fell into numerous temptations. Over and over and over.

How are we supposed to stand a chance?

Well, WWJD? Or better yet, what did Jesus do?


The temptation of Jesus is a very important part of the Bible. It's found in three of the Gospels and occurs right after Jesus' baptism.

I think that it's easy to be in awe of Jesus. He's the Son of God after all. He can walk on water, heal the sick, and even turn water into wine. Certainly, He can resist a little temptation. I like the verse from Hebrews. It shows something that can be forgotten sometimes. On earth, Jesus was fully God but also fully human. He had the full human experience. He went through joy, happiness, peace, laughter, and much more. But after fasting in the desert, when Satan himself came to Him, my guess is Jesus was experiencing more along the lines of pain, sadness, loneliness, and hunger, and not for the last time in His life.

Even going through some of the worst of life, what did Jesus do when tempted? He resisted by leaning on God's Word. Through three grueling temptations, Jesus quotes Scripture and resists. Pain, sadness, loneliness, hunger, and temptation. Sympathizing with our weaknesses. Jesus is the ultimate example for us. Temptation isn't something we outgrow. Money, power, anger, fame, grades, work performance, and your future can all be temptations.

Learn as we did at HYPE'D: don't believe the lie like Eve, run away from it like Joseph, and use God's Word like Jesus.


