PASTOR'S PEN: THE OTHER WISEMAN



Henry Van Dyke was a Presbyterian pastor, an author, an English professor, and even a diplomat. In 1895, he was the pastor of the Brick Church in New York City. There, he wrote *The Story of the Other Wise Man*, which is a favorite of many at Christmastime. In the gospel of Matthew, we learn about how Magi from the East follow a star to discover the new King of Israel born in Bethlehem. Van Dyke imagines another wise man named Artaban, who follows the same star. However, this wise man is delayed. He arrives late to Bethlehem,

where the other magi and the Holy Family have already left. Thus begins a lifelong quest to find this king and Messiah.

Along the way, Artaban learns some valuable lessons about the nature of Jesus' Kingdom. Jesus came into the world, not among the upper reaches of society, but into the family of a poor carpenter. He was celebrated not by King Herod and the elite but by a rag-tag group of shepherds. He was rejected by the religious leaders but heralded by a group of Gentile astrologers. He didn't hang out with the rich and powerful but with sinners, prostitutes, and tax collectors. In his own words, Jesus said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick" (Matthew 9:12). This king doesn't lord over us but instead acts as the Great Physician who offers comfort, grace, and healing. Van Dyke's story serves as an invitation to join in Christ's ministry to the world. As the Apostle John writes, "We love because he first loved us" (1 John 4:19).

After last year's great success of Dickens' *A Christmas Carol* for the radio, the Presbyterian Radio Players are at it again. This year we have adapted Van Dyke's story starring our own Dawson Strong as Artaban. You can catch it on WLKR 92.9 FM on December 22 at 5:00pm and Christmas Eve at 9 pm. (If you missed last year's A Christmas Carol, it will be on at 11 pm on Christmas Eve.)

Van Dyke also wrote hymns. The most famous was "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee." It's a celebration of God's creation, but the last verse, like his Christmas story, serves as an invitation.

"Mortals, join the mighty chorus, Which the morning stars began; God's own love is reigning o'er us, Joining people hand in hand."

Artaban learns to love as he seeks the Christ child. This Christmas season, let that be said of us.

NEWS FROM SESSION



NOVEMBER 2023

The 2024 Stewardship Campaign is complete. 2024 pledges were up 6% over 2023 pledges. Thanks to the congregation for their overflowing generosity. Some remaining details for the 2024 budget need to be considered before the budget can be approved at the December meeting. Session thanked Pat Babcock for all she does as treasurer. The Nominating Committee met again on November 14th to select additional candidates for Deacons. Pastor James is contacting the candidates. Please continue to pray for the candidates.

FPC received the Crossroads Survey report. The participation rate was around 93% which shows great investment and interest of the congregation in this process. The Steering Committee, comprised of Pastor James, Julie Murdock, Chris Canfield, and Curt Markley, will be reviewing the report and reporting to the congregation. Focus groups will be interviewed in February 2024 to gain additional insight into the survey results. Anyone interested in helping with the Focus Group interviews should contact a member of the Steering Committee.

Building and Grounds Committee members are scheduled to make building rounds looking for leaks or other issues. They are also consulting with the garden club regarding the courtyard landscaping. On November 15th Dawson Strong started as interim Youth Director. Volunteers are needed for ADVENTures on December 3rd and for the youth groups. Contact Kathleen Wheeler or Dawson Strong if you're interested.

The Thanksgiving Dinner was a huge success with 131 people attending. Thanks to all who helped with this event. Session approved the Presbyterian Women conducting a shoe drive. Logistics are being worked out to host 10-12 students from Hanmi Presbyterian over the Christmas holiday. The Mission Committee will be showcasing our mission partners during ADVENTures. We are still looking for people to ring bells for the Salvation Army on December 16th. If you're interested in ringing, sign up in the Narthex or contact Dale Rafie.

The Outreach Committee completed the annual roll review. The Personnel Committee is conducting annual staff performance evaluations. Session accepted the 2022 Financial Audit Report. There were no findings. Session thanked the audit committee for their efforts and hard work. Session approved the 2024 Communion Schedule presented by the Worship Committee. The sermon series for Advent is "The Unexpected". Westminster Voices is preparing a musical Christmas Program, "Heaven's Child", that will be presented on December 17th at the late service. The Presbyterian Radio Players program, "The Other Wiseman," will be aired on WLKR on December 22nd at 5:00 p.m. and on December 24th at 9:00 p.m.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Did you know that you can arrange for mandatory distributions from your IRA to be paid directly to First Presbyterian Church without having to pay federal income taxes on the distributions? Well you can! Individuals can donate up to \$100,000 annually, and married couples who qualify separately up to \$200,000.

To qualify, you must be age 70 ½ or older at the time of the distribution and the proceeds must be paid directly to the qualified charity. The donations can even be made monthly.

So You think you know..... Our Interim Youth Director??

While the subject of December's "So You Think You Know..." article is not a new member, it's a long-time member in a new position!

Dawson Strong is our new Interim Youth Director, and we are so excited!

Dawson is a 2020 graduate of Norwalk High school, and more recently, a Dec. 2022 graduate of Cedarville University, Cedarville, Ohio. He majored in broadcast production and digital media. He also earned a minor in theater and biblical studies.

In his spare time, Dawson enjoys both physical and artistic pursuits. Disc golf is his go to sport; he says it's not as expensive as other sports and he gets to spend time outdoors. Dawson also enjoys playing the piano and screen writing in both short form (about 30 pages) as well as feature length (about 90 pages). He has a few of each under his belt. He is also involved with fantasy football (and is having a pretty good season!).



Dawson's favorite (non-biblical) book is "Save the Cat: The Last Book on Screenwriting You'll Ever Need" by Blake Snyder. While many of us may not have heard of that book before, he notes that it is very well-known in production and media circles and has had a big influence on him. Reading this book enabled Dawson to see that he could write a screenplay – it gave him hope and encouragement as well as motivation. He also finds motivation in scripture. Dawson's favorite verse is Proverbs 14:23, "In all toil there is profit, but mere talk leads only to poverty." In his words, don't talk the talk if you don't walk the walk. He values leading by example, not just words.

Although he had to think about it, Dawson's favorite hymn and worship song is, "Amazing Grace (My Chains Are Gone), an adaptation by Chris Tomlin. The hymn "Amazing Grace" has always been a favorite of his as it is very powerful, and the background story is amazing. The words of Tomlin's adaptation are also very powerful. Dawson plays this on the piano in many different circumstances. He is not sure that many people know he plays the piano, but most people also don't know that he acted in productions during college. He recalls playing the character "Asher" in the play "The Giver" as one example.

Dawson feels that God has been a part of his education from the very beginning. He attended a Christian preschool and then Trinity Christian Academy before finishing his schooling at NHS. He then went to Cedarville which is a Christian college. He feels that God's presence throughout his life has prepared him for life today. When he was younger, he came to youth group under Brandon Newell, but the leader that had the most impact on him was Don Renninger. Dawson's desires for the youth under his leadership are two-fold. First, he wants to assure the youth that he is there for them in any situation, that they can confide in him knowing he is on their side. He wants to help them develop a Christian way of thinking now so that when they encounter problems in the future, they will know how to approach them. Secondly, Dawson would like the youth program and participants to be more present and visible in the life of the church. He would like the youth to participate in church services more, whether it be through music, reading, or whatever. He would also like to see more in the congregation become involved with the youth at any level. He understands that youth often have difficulties talking to the older generations as the older generations feel awkward talking to the youth. He wants to serve as a bridge so that deeper ties can be formed.

Dawson, we are so excited to have you on staff! May God bless and multiply your ministry as only He can, and we look forward to the fruit it will bear!

<u>ADVENTURES! SUNDAY DECEMBER 3RD!</u>






DECEMBER KIDS SUNDAY MORNING SCHEDULE




