Matthew 25:1-13



Every morning, people arise ready to face a new day. They make the coffee, check the news, and make their morning jog before the darkness turns to light. Then, there are the rest of us. Morning comes as an unwelcome intrusion into our rest. When the alarm sounds, we amazingly complete complex mathematical calculations to determine if we have time for ten more minutes of sleep. Even the most chipper morning person I know occasionally reaches for the snooze bar. Simply put, waking up is hard to do.

At least once a year in our house, we change our alarm. We get accustomed to the bells and whistles of one and need another. Thankfully, plenty of inventors are not content to let sleeping dogs lie. I read recently about an alarm clock that launches three puzzle pieces into the air when the alarm sounds. The sleeper must locate the pieces and place them in the correct order before the snooze bar will end the annoying sound.


Why do some of us have so much trouble waking up? Some say that we are overworked. Others say the issue is related to genetics. Still others argue that we spend too much time on screens. Personally, I think that I'm like that little kid who doesn't want to go to bed. I think I might miss something exciting. I greedily hold onto yesterday, trying to stretch it out.

We have a tendency to do the same in our spiritual lives. We want the love of God. We desire a life motivated by hope. We have experienced the grace found in Jesus Christ. However, we still hold onto former desires and priorities. We are not ready to be transformed. We cling to old behaviors and attitudes not consistent with our new lives in Christ. When the call comes on Easter morning, we reach for the snooze bare, exhausted.

"If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation" (2 Corinthians 5:17). This does not mean that we add a religious category to an already busy "to-do" list. Instead, our list becomes transformed. We leave behind those things unpleasing to our Savior, and we do everything from this day forward to the glory of God in Jesus Christ.

# **NEWS FROM SESSION**



Session met with several confirmands at the beginning of the meeting. The 2024 Confirmation Class will be accepted as new members in April. Dawson Strong shared some of his thoughts on the Youth Director position. The Boundary Training policy was approved. The committee procedures, policies, and guidelines were approved as revised or reaffirmed. The church will be closed on April 8<sup>th</sup> due to the solar eclipse.

Building and Grounds reported the Chancel lights were repaired. The sump and lift pumps were tested, and the gutters were cleaned on March 3<sup>rd</sup>. Presbyterian Women donated \$10,000 to Building and Grounds for maintenance of the storage building. Electricity and gutters will be added soon. The Christian Education Committee shared its Vision Statement for 2024. Session endorsed the senior high mission trip to Puerto Rico in July. Twelve youth and three adults will be going. A New Members class begins on April 21<sup>st</sup>. Preparations for Vacation Bible School are well underway. The theme is *Twists and Turns, Following Jesus Changes the Game*.

The Fellowship Committee reported that Lenten Soup Suppers are going well with an average attendance of around 58 people. Session approved the Belize Mission Trip for February 2025. Fellowship will be hosting a dinner on Maundy Thursday at 5:30 pm. The Youth are having a movie night event on April 5<sup>th</sup> and Fellowship is providing drinks and snacks. The Outreach Committee continues planning for the 2024 National Day of Prayer. Breakfast will be served at 6:30 am followed by a worship service at 7:00 am. John Soisson will be the guest speaker. The Radio Program has been funded for another quarter thanks to a generous donation.

The Stewardship Committee reported that Jeff Polcar, Wells Fargo Advisors, provided a review of the investment portfolio which is doing well. The Worship Committee is preparing for Holy Week worship services and Easter Sunday worship services. The Joyful Ringers and Hodge Podge will resume rehearsals soon.

The Crossroads Steering Committee developed a Discovery Report that summarizes the survey results and the information gathered during the Focus Group discussions. This information was used by the Vision Team during its first retreat on March 2<sup>nd</sup>. So far, we have looked at *Who we are*. During the second retreat in May, we will be looking at *Where God is leading us*. A communication plan will be developed to share this information with the congregation.

Well you can! Individuals can donate up to \$100,000 annually, and married couples who qualify separately up to \$200,000.

To qualify, you must be age 70 ½ or older at the time of the distribution and the proceeds must be paid directly to the qualified charity. The donations can even be made monthly. Consult your financial advisor or contact the church office to take advantage of this strategy.

Here's what we found out in our latest interview.

#### What's your background?

I graduated from Ashland University with a Bachelor's in Music Education. I was then hired as the choir director for grades 6-12 in New London. I also was director/choreographer/vocal instructor for various musicals and plays, Show Choir, A Cappella Choir, several area Honors choirs and was the Artistic/Choral Director for the Ashland Symphonic Youth Chorus.

I went back to college at Ashland University and received my Master's in Education, Curriculum and Development. After our first child was born, I started working part-time at First Pres. as your Children and Families Director. When our third child was born, I quit and took some time at home to be a full-time Mommy. A few years later, this job came knocking again, and here we are!

#### Where are you from?

I have lived in this area my entire life. Born at a hospital in Sandusky; lived in Clyde, Bellevue, Castalia, Monroeville, Ashland, New London, Norwalk, and Milan, which is where we live now.

#### What is your favorite Scripture or book of the Bible? Why?

"I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength" (Philippians 4:13).

This was the verse I chose when I was in confirmation, and it has given me great strength and hope through many of life's challenges.

#### What are your favorite hymns or worship songs?

How much time do you have? I don't know if it's a credo per say, but I often try to shift perspective and look on the bright side of life. The silver lining to the cloud, rainbows during rain, don't sweat the small stuff kind of mentality seems to keep me focused on what really matters. I'd say I am a realistic optimist. I don't pretend negative things don't exist, but at the same time, I choose to focus more on what is still positive during those moments. "Paint things in a positive light," as they say.

#### What do you like best about VBS?

Oh gosh! Since you probably don't want a generic, "Everything!" answer, I'd have to say it's probably the end of the day, Iol. Don't get me wrong, I absolutely love the days of VBS and teaching kids, hearing laughter and learning down every hall, and watching everything fall into place, but there's just something super special when you see a job well done! Kids are leaving, excited to tell their parents about their day or asking to bring their friends tomorrow. Teachers are worn out but so happy with what they accomplished. You get to breathe again after the chaos but jump right back into prepping and planning for the next day. This is really the time that I see the dedication of our volunteers and the excitement for Jesus in our kids.

# From the Underground......



Springtime is my favorite time of the year. Maybe it's because of how much I despise winter, but I always get thrilled when the spring season rolls around. The trees and flowers bloom, gardens are planted, while the animals and children start frolicking. It's also when I start to notice butterflies again. Whenever I see butterflies, the infamous "butterfly effect" comes to mind.

I find it hard sometimes to feel like my choices matter. Especially when it seems like God isn't there. That's why I remember Ruth and Esther. The two female-named books in the Bible have a lot in common and can unite for an outstanding message.

In Ruth, God is hardly mentioned. And in Esther, God is flat-out not mentioned at all. Why?

Ruth asks us to look at the relationship between God's purposes and human decisions. Throughout the book, the choices of the characters matter. Ruth chooses to stay with Naomi, even though it will be extremely difficult. Boaz chooses to allow Ruth to pick in his field. The family redeemer chooses not to redeem because Ruth is a Moabite. Boaz chooses to redeem Naomi and Ruth. Looking back at Ruth, every choice, mundane or otherwise, matters and leads to redemption. Not just for Naomi and Ruth, but for all of us. \*Take a look at the genealogy at the end of Ruth.

As for Esther, the choices the characters make are less worthy of imitation. They get drunk, they get angry, and they even murder. The Jews are in exile and unable to obey God's law. God seems absent from this story, from the choices. He seems done with Israel. Is He?

Of course not. God isn't mentioned by name, but that doesn't mean that He isn't there. He's working in the mess and moral ambiguity of human life. He uses the faithfulness of even morally compromised people to do His purposes. Esther asks us to trust God's providence even when we can't see it. That requires a posture of hope, to believe that, no matter how horrible things get, God is committed to redeeming His good world and overcoming evil. God's involvement in our daily lives may be hard to see. Seemingly impossible at times. But no matter what, He is still working through our choices, through the flaps of our wings.

Our choices matter and when we choose good, when we choose God's way, He can use anything and anyone for His plan, including butterflies.
