

Aundrea Gordon?



Aundrea Gordon has been a beloved part of our church family since the 1990s. She recalls that time fondly when her daughter Amanda began attending youth group with Erin Scherz, prompting Aundrea and her husband, Mike, to attend services themselves.

A lifelong educator at heart, Aundrea retired in 2005 after 31 years of teaching, mostly energetic and curious Kindergarteners. Retirement didn't slow her down much, though. The following year, the church called her to serve as our Christian Education Director, a role she faithfully and joyfully filled for over seven years.

Faith has been a foundation throughout Aundrea's life. Growing up, her family provided incredible examples of Christian love and service. She remembers her grandparents' courage in the late 1950s and early '60s, standing up for justice by renting an apartment to a Black couple despite threats from the KKK. Another cherished memory is riding

horseback through the hills of Kentucky with her grandfather, who served as a mission pastor visiting remote mountain cabins.

Her small group here at FPC has been a source of love, comfort, support, and faith growth—especially through life's harder seasons. After losing Mike in 2020, the support of her small group, family, and lifelong friends helped her embrace a "new normal" and continue forward with hope. Her favorite verse is Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." It reminds Aundrea that Jesus will be by her side, giving her strength even when anxious or unsure.

Her family continues to be one of Aundrea's greatest blessings. Her daughter, Amanda, and son-in-law, Ben, have given her two wonderful grandchildren, ages 2 and 14. You can find her in Strongsville every Tuesday and Wednesday, spending time with them. Some of her favorite moments are hiking, biking, and "beaching" with her family.

When not spending time with family or serving the church, Aundrea loves riding her bike, hiking a trail, cozying up by the fire with a good book, enjoying a meal with friends, or scrapbooking memories. She especially cherishes mornings by the ocean, watching the sunrise.

With her years of service to children, it's not surprising that Aundrea's favorite Christian songs are "This Little Light of Mine" and "I've Got the Joy, Joy, Joy Down in My Heart!". These certainly reflect the joyful light she brings to our church family.




Operation Praise

No matter your stage of life, your weeks tend to look something like that monstrosity. Fill in the list with your own events and you'd get a good idea of your routine. How you spend your time in a given week with chores, work, school, taking care of other, social events. You get the idea.

What scares me is how we can lump our faith into our weekly routines. Sunday church and maybe youth group or a weekly Bible study for an hour. It becomes a checkbox in our mental schedules. How can we avoid this trap?

High school taught me a lot on how I wanted my future to look like. Perhaps most importantly, it showed me how much variety I need in my life. The weekly drab of MonTuesWedThursFRI almost lulled me into a mindless meandering of weekly living. I couldn't do that for the rest of my life. I needed change and new experiences or challenges to be my routine.

Now high school is my example. It could be yours. Or you could have loved every second of 9-12th, I will only silently judge if you did. But hopefully some examples from your life can help you think of what makes your routine the best and how it can keep you enjoying every week.

Don't make your faith a routine. I want that to be clear. I do want to use what I learned from my high school routine and apply it to our thinking on our faith. We need to be active and aware of what is going on in our journeys of faith in order to prepare us for a better future.

Lamentations 3:22-23 reminds us, "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness" (ESV). With deliberate and consistent focus, the mercies of God will be revealed in new ways, we will have fresh experiences and insights into our faith.

I'm someone who hangs on to analogies when trying to learn or explain topics. My mind always goes towards exercising. If you run once a week for the same speed and distance, you will eventually hit a point called a "workout plateau." This is when your body has adapted to your regimen and you stop seeing improvements. If a plateau is hit, you need to increase your speed or distance in order to keep growing and progressing.

If faith or church seems like part of your routine, you could be chillin on a spiritual plateau, which is dangerous. There is a sermon that mentions Revelations 3 and the church of Laodicea, so I won't get too deep into it. Just saying lukewarm and plateau seem eerily similar.

My purpose with all of this is simple: it's a call to self reflection. Even for myself. Is my faith growing? Am I actively seeking God and His mercies? Does my faith reflect all aspects of my life or just some? Do I act differently on Sundays than MTWTFS?


VBS CRICUT AND COOKIES PARTY:










We are having an awards show night for our final HYPED!


