

PASTOR'S PEN: "W.I.J.D."



On my bookshelf, I have a dusty old volume of Pastor Charles Sheldon's novel, In His Steps. The book was written in 1896 by Sheldon for his youth group in Topeka, Kansas. The novel tells the story of a pastor who challenges his congregation to live for one year, asking, "What would Jesus do?" The rest of the book outlines the transformed lives of the parishioners as they tackle the problems of poverty, economic exploitation, graft, and the like, all in the name of Jesus. The story epitomized the social gospel movement and its optimism in human efforts to solve human problems.

The book is not great literature, but amazingly, it continued to make an impact. In the 1990s, Dan Seaborn read the novel as a youth pastor in Michigan. He used the question as a rallying cry for his youth group. They made buttons with the letters WWJD, which led to a merchandising frenzy. Soon, one found WWJD everywhere, emblazoned on bracelets, T-shirts, bumper stickers, etc. The question became a credo for an entire subculture of Christians. Then the fad faded. Perhaps this is a good thing.

Don't get me wrong. I'm entirely in favor of promoting ethics based on the teachings of Jesus. The world would be a better place if more people patterned their lives after our Savior. However, the question itself is troublesome. "What would Jesus do?" is conditional. "Would" implies an "if" clause. "If Jesus was here, what would he do?" As Christians who live in the sunlight of Easter, we can no longer speak conditionally.

"Christ is risen. He is risen, indeed."

The resurrection refuses to allow Jesus to slip into the sands of time. Instead, we believe in his reality and his continued actions on our behalf. His teachings remain valid because his kingdom remains an actuality. The Christian writer and scholar Leonard Sweet puts it this way: "The question is not 'What would Jesus do?' Instead, the question is 'What is Jesus doing?'"

With all respect to Rev. Sheldon, we should take on a new challenge this Easter. Because Jesus is alive, let us ask, "What is Jesus doing right now?" Let's live the next year asking, "What is Jesus doing in our congregation, in our families, in our lives?" When we get that answer, let's join Christ in this Resurrection Movement.

Barb Fries?

She is grateful for their place in the family as well. Barb loves that her son, Andy, has moved back to Ohio. That

makes spending time with his kids a little easier. One family tradition goes back to her time on the farm. Every year, the whole family makes apple butter together, although Brice currently takes the lead. They even use the same family copper pot to make the treat.

For thirty years, Barb was a social worker. She served in both children's and adult protective services. In some ways, the adults could break her heart more. Barb felt the children often had stronger social networks than some of the elderly. Despite the challenges, she was always thankful for the many success stories.

Besides spending time with her grandkids, Barb likes to read, ride her bike, and go for walks. She does cross-stitch and enjoys watching John Wayne Westerns. She is known far and wide for her cookies and, over the years, made plenty with her grandkids. Barb is a choir member and loves the old hymns like "In the Garden" and "The Old Rugged Cross." She remembers singing them to the kids while rocking them to sleep at night.

Barb loves First Presbyterian, especially her small group. She has learned a lot, and they have been very supportive. Barb believes that's a characteristic of the whole church. "They would do anything for you." Her favorite Scripture comes from Ecclesiastes 3: "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven..." That chapter was a huge comfort at the time Barb's grandfather died. The two were very close, and she said, "At the time, I just needed to hear that Scripture."

When asked what advice she would give her grandkids during these challenging days, Barb says, "Faith over fear, and trust God."

Operation Praise










EASTER EGG HUNT - APRIL 20TH, 10AM




VBS CRICUT AND COOKIES PARTY:






